2022 was an exciting year for Woolwich Counselling Centre!


The need for mental health support within the community continued to significantly increase and as a result, the Board and staff worked together to support the growth in both staff and services.

Four new therapy staff were hired over the year (Kate Suffling, Di-Anne Martin, Kim Blackmore, and Sarah MacDonald) to join the existing team of Amanda Wood-Atkinson (Executive Director), Beth Mason (Program Director), Hannah Harman (Office Administrator), Shweta Satyan (Awareness and Engagement Coordinator), and counsellors Sue Martell, Andy Martin, Nadine Bengert, Katie Lawson, Janessa Bauman, Tyler Riepert, and Samantha Hicks.

Given the growth and increasing complexity of WCC, we identified the need to add a Finance team member to our administrative staff; the Finance and Operations Coordinator position was created, and filled by Christine Birch.

Furthermore, as Breslau was identified as the largest area of growth within the Township, an additional satellite counselling space was secured within the offices of another health care provider (Achieve Balance) located across from Breslau Public School. This space has been used for counselling starting in January 2023. Services continue to be offered in Wellesley Township in partnership with the Wellesley Township Community Health Centre.

During 2022, WCC led and participated in a number of fundraising events – after several years pause due to Covid. New in 2022, WCC established a successful fundraiser named the WCC Mental Health Move-A-Thon, held during the week of May 2nd – 8th. A number of successful community fundraisers were also initiated over the year including support from the Challenge Accepted Foundation, Pam Esbaugh's Pam's Fit World, and the returning Community Choirs and Carols organized by the Elmira Ministerial.

This year has also been a year of reconnecting with the community in both familiar and new ways. We have worked together with community partners to support mental health in the rural areas, we have had opportunities to showcase our work with new and existing funders, and we have worked with partners to bring more funded services to our local area (such as services through the Ontario Structured Psychotherapy program, and Children and Youth Mental Health).

Locally, we have established strong relationships with faith communities, community clubs, schools, EarlyON centres, the Region of Waterloo Library, and local businesses. We work in partnership to offer workshops to these groups, as well as individual counselling support as needed.

The Board also made some significant progress in governance areas – such as developing and implementing a new Board Governance Manual which provides the Board with a framework for supporting WCC and the decision-making process; undergoing a fulsome risk management discussion and implementing an action plan, as well as establishing an evaluation process for the Board. The Centre's Operating policies also underwent significant revision this year.




Mission:


