LEADERSHIP REPORT

As we reflect on the activities of the past year, we recognize that an agency such as Woolwich Counselling Centre (WCC) truly gets its strength from being part of the fabric of our community. It is a time to celebrate the meaningful work that is accomplished each day at WCC – by the community and for the community.

As an organization, we continued to see growth over the past year. In February 2023, we opened a satellite location in Breslau at Achieve Balance – offering one day per week of counselling support in that location, in addition to our ongoing presence in Wellesley one day per week. As of June, our main site in Elmira is now open on Fridays.

In addition to this physical growth, this year we saw the continued growth of several of our programs and initiatives. We were awarded a Hallman grant to offer continued support for school-age children and were pleased to continue our partnerships with local schools. We offered a new Quick Response service for children and youth – a no cost counselling support to any child and youth in the Woolwich and Wellesley Townships.

Furthermore, in partnership with the Counselling Collaborative of Waterloo Region, we were awarded a large grant from the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services in the Ontario Autism Program. This grant allowed us to build capacity in our local mental health system to offer services for autistic children and youth. Woolwich Counselling Centre acted as the lead of this project, and collectively, we gathered feedback, developed recommendations, and trained over 50 therapists to better support the mental health needs of neurodivergent children and their families.

Recognizing that our Strategic Plan from 2020-23 was coming to a close, the Board and staff established some new goals for the coming years. A few of these goals are focused on the priorities of suicide prevention, continued work to raise awareness of the Centre, as well as excellence in service. Many thanks to the ways in which both staff and the Board work together to move forward with this shared vision.





The Board also continued to tighten our governance through launching a Board SharePoint site and completing a Board Performance Evaluation. This helped us set governance goals for the upcoming year. Through the Finance and Audit Committee, we also completed a thorough review and recommendation of the fee structure – which had not been revised for the past 5 years.

In conclusion, it has been another incredible year at Woolwich Counselling Centre. We are grateful to the Board, staff, volunteers, clients, partners and donors for their continued investment and support of this agency. We are privileged to provide leadership to this remarkable group of people and remain committed to the vision that Woolwich and Wellesley Townships will be emotionally and mentally healthy.


