2024 was a meaningful and dynamic year for Woolwich Counselling Centre.

We continued to provide high-quality, professional counselling services while expanding our reach and deepening community engagement around mental health awareness.

Early in the year, we introduced new ranges on our sliding fee scale to ensure affordability while aligning better with the true cost of care. In February, we launched a *free first session* initiative for new clients in Woolwich and Wellesley Townships, which has helped make services even more accessible.

Community outreach grew significantly. Most notably, we hosted a large community event - *Together for Mental Health*. Held in May at Elmira District Secondary School, this event brought together over 700 people and more than 20 local organizations. With powerful keynote speakers like Hayley Wickenheiser and Corey Hirsch, the day was a true celebration of community and mental health awareness.

Our partnerships remained strong—we delivered workshops across local schools, care homes, EarlyON centres, and businesses. We also joined *Engage Rural*, a new collaboration of 8 rural agencies, to pursue shared funding opportunities, including grants for youth mental health and violence prevention initiatives.

At our April AGM, we recognized long-time board member Kathryn Seiling and welcomed new leadership. The meeting also included important governance updates to align with new provincial legislation.

Internally, we remained focused on service quality, expanding offerings for clients with ADHD symptoms and receiving consistently positive feedback. In October, board and staff engaged in a strategic planning session to shape our goals for 2025.

And finally, we want to acknowledge our incredible staff team. Their dedication and compassion are the heart of this organization. We also welcomed Muneeb Shahid to the team and said goodbye to our long-serving colleague Andy Martin with deep gratitude.

Thank you to everyone—staff, board, partners, and our community for helping make 2024 a year of impact, growth, and connection.
